This dataset will provide the ability to report an access measure for admitted patients and counts of non-admitted services (not people).

Improving the identification of Indigenous Australians within this data.

Only separations can be reported and not the number of people. Hospital systems do not currently contain information to allow the identification of records belonging to the same individual so person counts are not currently possible. Further work is also required in relation to inconsistencies in reporting types of sub-acute care.
