Definition: The term used to describe a variety of signs, symptoms, and physical findings that result from the long-term damage to the middle ear by infection and inflammation. This includes the following:

- severe retraction or perforation of the tympanic membrane (a hole in the tympanic membrane)
- scarring or erosion of the small, sound conducting bones of the middle ear
- chronic or recurring drainage from the ear
- inflammation causing erosion of the bony cover or the facial nerve, balance canals, or cochlea (hearing organ)
- erosion of the bony borders of the middle ear or mastoid, resulting in infection spreading to the meninges (the coverings of the brain) or brain
- presence of cholesteatoma
- persistence of fluid behind an intact tympanic membrane.
