

## Episode of care—mental health legal status

### Identifying and definitional attributes

**Definition:** Whether a person is treated on an involuntary basis under the relevant state or

territory mental health legislation, at any time during an episode of admitted patient care, an episode of residential care or treatment of a patient/client by a community

based service during a reporting period.

Involuntary patients are persons who are detained in hospital or compulsorily treated in the community under mental health legislation for the purpose of

assessment or provision of appropriate treatment or care.

**Context:** Mental health care:

This metadata item is required to monitor trends in the use of compulsory treatment provisions under State and Territory mental health legislation by Australian hospitals and community health care facilities, including 24-hour community based residential services. For those hospitals and community mental health services which provide psychiatric treatment to involuntary patients, mental health legal status information is an essential metadata item within local record systems.
