## Collection and usage attributes

<b>Guide for use:</b>	<p>Report the primary site of cancer, if known, for patients who have been diagnosed with a cancer.</p> <p>In ICDO, primary site is identified using both the Cxx.x code identifying site and the behaviour code to identify whether the site is the primary site. The behaviour code numbers used in ICDO are listed below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>0 Benign</li><li>1 Uncertain whether benign or malignant<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• borderline malignancy</li><li>• low malignant potential</li></ul></li><li>2 Carcinoma in situ<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• intraepithelial</li><li>• non-infiltrating</li><li>• non-invasive</li></ul></li><li>3 Malignant, primary site</li><li>6 Malignant, metastatic site<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• malignant, secondary site</li></ul></li><li>9 Malignant, uncertain whether primary or metastatic site</li></ul>
