- The home lacked the amenities or resources necessary for living.

Context: There is considerable concern over the number of homeless

people in society and the assistance they require.

Collecting information on homeless people is problematic, as the concept of 'homelessness' encompasses elements in addition to

whether, someone resides in a dwelling or not.
