- 10. Social and community participation includes assistance with shopping, banking, participating in recreational, cultural or religious activities, attending day centres, managing finances and writing letters.

Case management refers to the need for assistance with planning and co-ordination of an appropriate range of services by clients with complex care needs eg the type of assistance provided by Community Care Package providers, COPS and Linkages agencies.
