## Identifying and definitional attributes

<b>Metadata item type:</b>	Data Element Concept
<b>METEOR identifier:</b>	302666
<b>Registration status:</b>	<a href="#">Housing assistance</a> , Superseded 30/08/2017
<b>Definition:</b>	A unique identifier (within a household) assigned to an income unit within a housing assistance agency.
<b>Context:</b>	Income units are one of the main counting units in housing assistance data and as such it is essential to be able to uniquely identify them.

## Object Class attributes

### Identifying and definitional attributes

<b>Object class:</b>	<a href="#">Income unit</a>
<b>Definition:</b>	One person or a group of related persons within a household, whose command over income is shared, or any person living in a non private dwelling who is in receipt of personal income.
<b>Context:</b>	<p>Income units are restricted to relationships of marriage (registered or de facto) and of parent/<a href="#">dependant</a> who usually reside in the same household. This means that an income unit can be defined as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• a married couple or sole parent, and dependent children only</li><li>• a married couple only with no dependent children present</li><li>• a person who is not related to any other household member either by marriage or by the parent/<a href="#">dependant</a> relationship.</li></ul> <p>This is the standard statistical unit for analyses of economic wellbeing, and can be an important measure in assessing the needs and circumstances of individuals and families.</p>
<b>Specialisation of:</b>	<a href="#">Person/group of persons</a>
