ACAT teams submit their data to the state evaluation unit. The state evaluation unit submits their data to the ACAP National Data Repository managed by the Department of Health and Ageing.

The tables for this indicator were prepared by the Department of Health and Ageing. The data quality statement was developed by the Department and includes comments from the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW). The AIHW did not have all of the relevant datasets required to independently verify the data tables for this indicator. For further information see the AIHW website.

Timeliness: The reference period for this data set is 2007–08. Data are provided to the NMDS

on a quarterly basis. The data are available for any financial year by June the

following year.

Accessibility: Aggregated data items from the ACAP NMDS are published in the Productivity

Commission's Report on Government Services, and in the Reports on the Operation of the Aged Care Act 1997 prepared by the Department of Health and

Ageing.

Program.
