**Further data development / collection required:** Indicators (e.1) and (e.2) require significant data development and are not being reported for the baseline CRC report. An interim measure for (e.3) will be available.

Indicator (e.1) is intended to give a service system identified measure of unmet demand as a proportion of confirmed demand. Definitional work to inform data development for Indicator (e.1) is proceeding under NDA Priority A Deliverable 3. This indicator will be based on jurisdiction demand data, which will need to be comparable with regards to definitions, items and computation methods.

**Other issues caveats:** Available disaggregation depends on sampling errors and other caveats.
