## Collection and usage attributes

<b>Guide for use:</b>	<p>CODE 1 Protective services</p> <p>Includes case plan development and management.</p> <p>CODE 2 Intensive family support services</p> <p>Those services that aim to prevent imminent separation of children from their primary caregivers because of child protection concerns, and those services that aim to reunify families where separation has already occurred.</p> <p>CODE 3 Other support services</p> <p>Those services not included above that are either funded or provided by the Department responsible for child protection.</p> <p>CODE 4 Respite care</p> <p>Out-of-home care provided on a temporary basis. For example, when the parents or guardians are ill or unable to care for the child on a short term basis. This does not include emergency care provided to children who have been removed for their homes for protective reasons.</p> <p>CODE 5 Advice/referral to another type of service</p> <p>Any service that is not provided or funded by the Department responsible for child protection. This can include: mental health, education, drug and alcohol, community health, private psychologists, etc</p>
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## Data element attributes

### Collection and usage attributes

<b>Guide for use:</b>	This information should be provided as a new service is being provided to the child. However, it should only be updated once per type of service. For example, if a child's family is provided with general family support more than once, it should only be recorded the first time the child's family uses this support.
<b>Collection methods:</b>	To be completed as services are provided.
