Cancer centres treat patients of all age groups with cancer, paediatric cancer centres treat cancer patients who are under 18 years of age, general hospitals treat patients of all age groups with varying healthcare requirements, and general paediatric hospitals treat patients who are under 18 years of age with varying healthcare requirements.
