Multiple measures for this indicator give person and system level perspectives on unmet demand.</p> <p>Need for formal assistance as a proportion of inferred demand—computation is based on the argument that every statement of need is explicitly, or implicitly, a claim (see Spicker 2008). This measure is based on sample survey estimates.</p>
