Collection and usage attributes

It is recognised that two or more people may equally share the caring role (e.g. mother and father) however, for the purposes of the Disability Services National Minimum

Data Set, characteristics are only requested for one of these carers. The

expressed views of the service user and/or their carer or significant other should be used as the basis for determining which carer should be considered to be the main

carer in this regard.

Collection methods: When asking the person about the age of their carer it is considered more

appropriate to ask about broad age groups rather than actual age.
