# Identifying and definitional attributes

**Metadata item type:** Glossary Item

METEOR identifier: 530152

Registration status: <u>Indigenous</u>, Standard 08/08/2014

**Definition:** A classification that estimates the degree of handicap associated with hearing loss

in the better ear and links to predicted consequences and recommended rehabilitation. Hearing impairment classification applies a graded scale - mild, moderate, severe and profound - based on degree of deviation from normal

thresholds in the better ear as recorded through audiometry.
