

Property: <u>Target group</u>

Definition: A group of people sharing a common characteristic or set of characteristics which

a particular government policy or program, or agency seeks to assist.

Context: Target group is used in describing community services agencies, in service

planning and in comparing community needs and service availability. Target groups may relate to population groups or communities, families/households, individuals, organisations or labour force groups. Characteristics may include age, cultural identity, geographic location, specific needs and other relevant characteristics.
