In the context of PBS data, this data element describes the approval number of the pharmacy that claimed for the supply of the PBS item and is referred to within the PBS system as 'Supplying pharmacy ID'.

The sixth character is an alphabetic check digit.

This data element can be used to identify individual pharmacies and may, in some use cases, need to be suppressed or de-identified.
