Use if it is unknown whether a current, documented and approved case plan was in place on the night of 30 June in the reference period.

Collection methods: If the child was required to have a case plan on the night of 30 June (code 1 was entered for 'case plan required indicator'), code 1, 2 or 9 should be recorded for this item.

Code 9 should only be recorded if it was unknown whether a plan was in place on the night of 30 June in the reference period.

If code 2, 7 or 9 was recorded for 'case plan required indicator', then code 7 should be recorded for this item.
