Guide for use:	<p>Opiate substitution program refers to a program for opiate addicts which aims to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • reduce the harm associated with drug use; • improve overall quality of life; and • ease the discomfort of withdrawing from heroin. <p>It includes both:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • maintenance (or long term) programs, where the goal is to reduce the harm associated with drug use and to improve overall quality of life; and • withdrawal (or short term) programs, where methadone is used to ease the discomfort of withdrawing from heroin.
Comments:	Examples of opioid substitution programs include methadone, naltrexone, buprenorphine, suboxone and LAAM.
