DSS specific information:

A government is a state or territory department, or another government authority authorised under adoption legislation to make the decision about the placement of an adoptive child.

A non-government organisation is an agency, approved to undertake adoption arrangements in Australia, that is not owned or controlled by the Australian Government or by a state or territory government. Such agencies could include church organisations, registered charities, non-profit organisations, companies, and cooperative societies and associations.
