Computation description:	<p>Count of regular clients who are Indigenous, aged 50 and over and who are immunised against influenza.</p> <p>'Regular client' refers to a client of an Australian Government Department of Health-funded primary health-care service (that is required to report against the Indigenous primary health care key performance indicators) who has an active medical record; that is, a client who has attended the Department of Health-funded primary health-care service at least 3 times in 2 years.</p> <p>For Indigenous people aged 50 and over, the <i>Australian Immunisation Handbook</i> (DoH 2017) recommends immunisation against influenza. An Indigenous person aged 50 and over is immunised against influenza if they have received an influenza vaccine within the previous year.</p> <p>Presented as a number.</p>
