Guide for use:	<p>Labour commences at the onset of regular uterine contractions, which act to produce progressive cervical dilatation, and is distinct from spurious labour or pre-labour rupture of membranes.</p> <p>CODE 1 Spontaneous</p> <p>Record if prostaglandins were given to induce labour and there is no resulting labour until after 24 hours.</p> <p>CODE 3 No labour</p> <p>Can only be associated with a caesarean section.</p>
