Guide for use: A discharge plan provides a plan for the continuity of care from prison to the community, and incorporates referrals to appropriate community-based services.

Health-related discharge planning could include, but is not limited to, the following activities:

- prison health staff interviewing the prisoner
- preparation of a discharge summary or discharge health report and letter for the prisoner's general practitioner (GP)
- coordination of referrals and making appointments for specialist consultations or hospital appointments
- referral to addiction services or the community mental health clinics/agencies or community forensic unit
- supply of medication to ensure adequate supplies until the ex-prisoner is reviewed by their GP
- provision of a chronic disease management education and care plan.
