Age-standardised percentages are directly age-standardised to the 2001 Australian population.</p> <p>95% confidence intervals are calculated for percentages.</p>
<b>Computation:</b>	$100 \times (\text{Numerator} \div \text{Denominator})$
<b>Numerator:</b>	Number of persons aged 15 and over who self-assess their health as 'excellent' or 'very good'.
