HoNOS 65+ is answered on an item-specific anchored 5-point scale with higher scores indicating more problems. Each scale is assigned a value of between 0 and 4, or 8 for unknown. The twelve scales are as follows:

- 1. behavioural disturbance
- 2. non-accidental self injury
- 3. problem drinking or drug use
- 4. cognitive problems
- 5. problems related to physical illness or disability
- 6. problems associated with hallucinations and delusions
- 7. problems associated with depressive symptoms
- 8. other mental and behavioural problems
- 9. problems with social or supportive relationships
- 10. problems with activities of daily living
- 11. overall problems with living conditions
- problems with work and leisure activities and the quality of the daytime environment.
