**Definition:** A sentinel event is a particular type of serious incident that is **wholly** 

preventable and has caused serious harm to, or the death of, a patient.

To be classified as a sentinel event, a strict set of criteria need to be met:

- The event should not have occurred where preventive barriers are available
- The event is easily recognised and clearly defined
- There is evidence the event has occurred in the past.

Sentinel events are further specified into eight events:

- Haemolytic blood transfusion reaction resulting from ABO (blood group) incompatibility
- 2. Infant discharge to the wrong family
- 3. Intravascular gas embolism resulting in death or neurological damage
- 4. Maternal death associated with pregnancy, birth or the puerperium
- 5. Medication error leading to the death of a patient reasonably believed to be due to incorrect administration of drugs
- 6. Procedures involving the wrong patient or body part resulting in death or major permanent loss of function
- 7. Retained instruments or other material after surgery requiring re-operation or further surgical procedure
- 8. Suicide of a patient in an inpatient unit.
