#### Guide for use:

The questions included ask the consumer to rate their difficulties against the following criteria:

- Managing day-to-day life (for example, getting to places on time, handling money, making everyday decisions)
- 2. Household responsibilities (for example, shopping, cooking, laundry, keeping room clean, other chores)
- 3. Work (for example, completing tasks, performance level, finding/keeping a job)
- 4. School (for example, academic performance, completing assignments, attendance)
- 5. Leisure time or recreational activities
- 6. Adjusting to major life stresses (for example, separation, divorce, moving, new job, new school, a death)
- 7. Relationships with family members
- 8. Getting along with people outside the family
- 9. Isolation or feelings of loneliness
- 10. Being able to feel close to others
- 11. Being realistic about yourself or others
- 12. Recognising and expressing emotions appropriately
- 13. Developing independence, autonomy
- 14. Goals or direction in life

- 0 No difficulty
- 1 A little difficulty
- 2 Moderate difficulty
- 3 Quite a bit of difficulty
- 4 Extreme difficulty
