ONS are defined as protein and energy nutrient-dense products purposed to increase dietary intake when diet alone is likely to be inadequate to meet nutritional requirements. These may include energy and protein enriched drinks (eg. milk, soy,

protein-fortified juice flavours), powders, soups, and/or desserts.
