<b>Description:</b>	<p>As part of the National Indigenous Reform Agreement (NIRA), the (then) Council of Australian Governments (COAG) agreed that the (then) Australian Government Department of Health and Ageing, in partnership with the state and territory health departments and in collaboration with the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW), would develop a set of Key Performance Indicators for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (First Nations) specific primary health care organisations.</p> <p>The purpose of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander specific primary health care national Key Performance Indicators (nKPIs) is to provide reporting organisations with data that they can use for continuous quality improvement (CQI) and are based on best practice/clinical guidelines in three areas which are important for the health of First Nations people:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• maternal and child health</li><li>• preventative health</li><li>• chronic disease management.</li></ul> <p>The data are also used at a national level to support policy, planning and progress (for example to consider progress against the COAG Closing the Gap targets, and support the national health goals set out in the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Plan 2021–2031).</p> <p>The population of interest in the nKPIs is the <a href="#">First Nations regular client</a> population of First Nations-specific primary health care organisations or maternal and child health programs/services funded by the Department of Health and Aged Care under its Indigenous Australians' Health Programme (IAHP), referred to as <a href="#">funded organisations</a>.</p> <p>From June 2023 'First Nations' became the preferred terminology within the AIHW. Please note that material published prior to this date may use the word 'Indigenous'. Terms such as 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander', 'Aboriginal' or 'Indigenous' may also be used when referring to the name of an organisation or Program'.</p>

## Collection and usage attributes

**National reporting arrangement:**

Each organisation funded by the Department of Health and Aged Care that is required to provide data to the nKPIs should record service provision in clinical information management systems that allow the electronic transmission of data for the [Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander specific primary health care national best endeavours data set](#) (ATSISPHC NBEDS), to be used in the calculation of the indicators. Exceptions may be made for organisations that do not have compatible clinical information management systems to manually upload data.

Reporting organisations provide nKPI data twice a year, with the census dates of 30 June and 31 December. Data submission is conducted via the Department of Health and Aged Care's Health Data Portal.

**Comments:** This indicator set relates to the 6 month period from 1 July 2023 to 31 December 2023; however, the period of data covered varies by indicator.
