<b>Computation description:</b>	The local arrangements should specify the: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Protocol or guideline to check the appointment timing with the patient and ideally book the appointment in days 5–10 of their menstrual cycle</li><li>• Consent policy that ensures patients are supported to make informed decisions about pelvic ultrasounds, including specific requirements for transvaginal ultrasounds, and</li><li>• Process to assess adherence to the local arrangements.</li></ul> <p>'Local arrangements' are policies, procedures and documented processes.</p>
<b>Computation:</b>	Yes/No <p>A healthcare setting that has documented evidence of locally approved arrangements that are implemented should record 'Yes.' Otherwise, the healthcare setting should record 'No.'</p>
